We would like you to choose a homework task from the table below and respond in a way that interests and motivates you.

SCIENCE

Demonstrate a weather experiment with the class and show the science behind the weather
e.g. make a tornado in a jar or make a simple windsock.

Create your own weather forecast for the class – you may want to create a Power Point presentation or background. You could even record it and play the video in school.



LITERACY

Write your own weather themed poem and illustrate it.

Research wild weather and create a weather information poster/booklet.



Make your own wild weather quiz booklet. You could include a word search, anagrams, riddles and/or spot the difference.

COMPUTING

Create a children's television show about wild weather. You could use LEGO, your toys and even yourself to explain different types of weather.



MATHS

Create number word problems to reveal factual information e.g. How many thunderstorms rain down on Earth every minute? a) 1 b) 200 c) 2,000



ART MUSIC

Create art work based on wild weather
e.g. stormy seas, blizzard scene



Write facts to a familiar song/nursery rhyme- could you teach the class your song?

Create a musical composition to accompany an image/story of a wild weather.
