

Our work this half term will focus on all areas linked to our topic – Treasure Island! This topic will allow children to explore what pirates are, what their different jobs onboard a ship are and learn about famous pirates. We will investigate where pirates have lived in the world, we will design a Pirate's Healthy Dish and create our own pirate hats. We will be writing our own diary entries as a pirate talking about our day on a pirate ship and also write instructions about where to find the buried treasure.

We will be using a variety of books to help us build on our knowledge of Pirates including: How to be a Pirate, Treasure Island, Pirate's Handbook, Pirate Ships, On a Pirate Ship, The Night Pirates and Pirates Love Underpants. If you have any books or items that you think link well with the topic please bring them in for us to share. Names on belongings, please! Thank you.

Our homework task this term involves a creative project based on pirates. Here are ideas you could base your project on: create a picture of life at sea on a pirate ship – you could draw, paint, collage or use chalk to create your picture; design and make a golden coin fit for a treasure chest; make a treasure chest full of treasure – you could use junk modelling or construction kits e.g. Lego; use your imagination to design a creative lunch fit for a pirate – record your ideas as a menu or as a drawing; design a pirate's outfit – thinking about suitable materials to withstand the wet and windy conditions out in sea, draw and label your designs, explaining why you chose the materials; imagine that you are a pirate on a voyage out at sea – write a letter to your family/friends telling them about your adventures or pretend you are a pirate who has been at sea for several months – write a diary describing life onboard the ship.

Homework is due in the last week of term which is **16**th **July**. I am looking forward to your child presenting their project. I have been very impressed so far!
