Barriers to educational achievement	<p>It is important to note that as an Enhanced Resource School, 64% of our children who are eligible for the grant have additional needs. As 69% of the children are boys, we are ensuring that the curriculum delivery and content is boy friendly and engages and enthuses all children. Some of these children have low attendance due to their medical needs and have many appointments and illness which effects their overall attendance. Many of these children make good from their starting points. 47% of PP children are working below the attainment level for their year group, which has an impact on our overall attainment data across the school.</p>
